Are your GI bill payments taxable? Payments you receive for education, training, or subsistence under any law administered by the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) are tax free. Do not include these payments as income on your federal tax return.

If you qualify for the American Opportunity Credit or Lifetime Learning Credit and are using the GI Bill you may have to reduce the amount of tax deductions you are due from those programs by the amount of GI Bill benefits you receive.

This applies only to the part of your GI Bill that is required to be used for education expenses.

So, if you are getting \$1,534 monthly housing allowance direct deposit to your checking account, and \$3,840 in tuition paid directly to your college neither of these benefits is taxable, and you do not report them on your tax return. This info was taken right off the IRS web page. Just thought it may be of interest to some of you.

November 15, 1777 -The Articles of Confederation were adopted by Continental Congress.


November 15, 1864 - During the American Civil War, Union troops under General William T. Sherman burned Atlanta.

☐ The men and women in labor and industry who provided the machinery and weapons of


war.

Veterans Resume Court Fight Over 'Non-VA Emergency Care' Costs

Earlier this year the Department of Veterans Affairs executed a clever rewrite of a regulation to avoid reimbursing hundreds of thousands of veterans for non-VA emergency health care costs that their own insurance plans failed to pay in full.

By inserting two words -"deductibles, coinsurance" into the revised rule, VA successfully neutralized the impact
of the 2016 Staab decision from
the U.S. Court of Appeals for
Veterans Claims to save billions
of dollars.

That court held unanimously in Staab that VA wrongly ignored the "plain language" of a 2010 statute intended to protect veterans with health insurance from having to pay hefty out-of-pocket costs for outside emergency care.

On Tuesday a new court battle began. The non-profit National Veterans Legal Services Program (NVLSP), which two years ago helped to defeat VA on behalf of the same class of veterans with unreimbursed emergency care expenses, filed a new class action lawsuit with the same appellate court in Washington D.C.

November 17, 1800 - The U.S. Congress met for the first time in the new capital at Washington, D.C. President John Adams then became the first occupant of the Executive Mansion, later renamed the White House.

November 17, 1869 - The Suez Canal was formally opened after more than 10 years of construction.

November 18, 1916 - During World War I, Allied General Douglas Haig called off the First Battle of the Somme after five months. The Allies had advanced 125 square miles at a cost of 420,000 British and 195,000 French soldiers. German losses were over 650,000 men.


